John Schindler & Friends
Concert to Help Asylum Seekers in Maine

Sunday, July 14 at 7 PM

Congregational Church of Boothbay Harbor Sponsored by the Mission Committee of the Church

All donations will be given to ILAP, Maine's Immigrant Legal Advocacy Project, for legal support to and representation of asylum seekers and refugees.

Originally from Saint Louis Missouri, John was influenced early on by that town's rhythm and blues and his Oklahoma mother's singing. This funky start was drastically tempered by a nine-year stint in a Catholic seminary where silence and Gregorian chant were his daily bread. After leaving the brotherhood, and armed only with his vow of poverty, John moved to New England and pursued the path of an itinerant musician, playing in sundry bands and bad barrooms. It was during this time, he realized, that his audience could not understand Latin. Winner of both the 2003 Boston Folk Festival Songwriting Contest and the 2006 Rose Garden Coffeehouse Song Contest, John has also been a finalist in many other song contests. His CD Memory Train was CD of the Week on Chicago's WFMT's Midnight Special. His new CD is *Two-Step Man*. John lives in Boothbay Harbor, ME with his wife, Jane and fat cat, Iko.

DEACON'S REPORT

Update from the Journey

Although the crucial step of seminary is complete, there is still more to go along my journey to ordained ministry. As many of you know, I have graduated from Boston University School of Theology with my Masters in Divinity degree. I earned a 3.69 GPA and was the President of the UCC student group during this last year. However, there are a few more steps to go before ordination. At most, I believe there is only Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE), writing a portfolio, revising my ecclesiastical paper, presenting said paper at an ecclesiastical council, and finding a full-time pastoral calling. Yet, there is a question as to whether the COM will be requiring the standard CPE or if there is an alternative path. Therefore, I ask for your continued prayers as I continue along this journey. Finally, the portfolio which I am writing requires confirmation from other people. So, our beloved deacons, who are my discernment committee, are helping to flesh out my strengths and limitations as a pastor. I will be making many sermons and liturgies available to them for this purpose. That said, I am happy to share past sermons, discuss seminary, and / or my theology in general with anyone, so, please let me know if you are interested in getting together for tea, coffee or just a nice conversation. May the blessings of God's love be with you all.

As one of our leaders of our BeFriender Ministry at CCBBH, I recently learned that some of you have turned down the offer of a BeFriender thinking you were coping well, or not struggling hard enough to accept one.

Anyone going through or experiencing change or stress can have a BeFriender! You don't have to be struggling. Just having someone to meet with you and hear your experiences without judgment, advice, or a personal stake in how you are doing such a family member, can be an uplifting experience.

We don't counsel or advise. We are engaged in a listening ministry to offer compassion and caring.

BeFriender Ministry is a national, ecumenical non-profit organization that provides leadership training and ongoing support for a listening ministry of lay pastoral care in churches.

Our principles are:

God is Present

BeFrienders are aware that they are in God's presence when befriending someone and that the time shared is a blessing to both the person befriended and the BeFriender.

Caring Not Curing

BeFrienders accept people as they are without telling them how they should be, listen with compassion without giving advice, and allow others to make their own decisions without trying to decide for them. The care offered by BeFrienders provides an opportunity for those they befriend to make choices and grow.

Nonjudgmental Presence

BeFrienders provide a sacred and safe space for someone to talk about their experiences, thoughts, and feelings without being judged or criticized.

Active Listening

The value and healing potential of having one's story heard is profound. BeFrienders actively listen by using communication skills that create an environment of respect and dignity.




