### TRUSTEES REPORT

The Trustees (mostly Wendy Wolf and Sandra Leonard with the help of the Deacons and Frank Helman) have finished reviewing the Church By-Laws and will present our revisions at the Annual Meeting in January. We've also completed the updates of all other Church policies. Many thanks to Heather Lorrain who was central to this effort!

Most of our group has been trained on CPR and the AED and we've also been pursuing changes to our building and processes to increase safety and security at the Church. More to come at the Annual Meeting.

We enter December in great financial shape – about \$20k to the good on revenue and about \$20k to the good on expenses. Budget surplus will go to a few key initiatives. First, we're closing the Capital Campaign having met all commitments – including adding \$97k to the Investment Fund. Second – we've paid for the Remembrance Garden in full. Finally, we're investing in additional hardware to improve overall safety and security at the Church both during the week and during worship.

The Church Fair was a huge success this year – great turnout, great soup, and over \$6k in fundraising across all groups participating. It's hard to look at 2018 and not feel pretty blessed.

Examining them individually and comparatively, Professor Muesse attempts to grasp the essential features of their lives and teachings and to explore the factors that contributed to their greatness. 
