TRUSTEES REPORT

The Trustees held a joint meeting with the Deacons to review Church finances and to discuss initiatives coming out of the May retreat.

We will begin the budgeting process in our October meeting and ask that you think about any changes your committee may have next year.

Over the summer we extended the lightening protection system to cover the renovated portions of the Church and now the building is fully protected again.

With much gratitude to Eric Marden, we were able to get some painting and repair work done to the steeple while in possession of the high lift.

Eric was also kind enough to help us replace the threshold leading into the sanctuary. Thank you, sir!

We now are turning our attention to repair of the steps on the side street entrance and will be replacing the shrub that didn't make it in the garden.

Our annual budget remains in good shape with pledges coming in better than expected and expenses coming in under plan. We're about \$16k to the good.

As we head into Stewardship Season, please consider the following facts from the May 2017 Parish Paper – Financing the Local Church: What Does It Cost?

- The annual budget for Protestant congregations averages between \$200,000 and \$250,000. Our 2017 budget is \$338,377.
- Operating expenses and staff account for 80% of the typical church budget. Our number is 81.7%.
- Because churches define the "mission" category portion of their budget differently, the typical percentage ranges from 15-30%. We're about 18.3%

It takes \$6500/week to run our church. Whether you pledge or give to loose plate, it's about \$50/person sitting in the congregation/week to make it happen.

The Befriender Lay Visitor Ministry: A Listening Presence, will be recruiting and training interested volunteers this winter. Our church sent Vicki Haugen and Shawn Lewin, to become program leaders, and under the guidance of our minister, Sarah Foulger, will train and oversee this volunteer visitor program. They do not replace our minister, but seek to support and increase the support available to church members. Befriender's offer the presence of support and active listening. Befrienders receive training on topics of listening, grief and loss, spirituality, confidentiality, and communication. Volunteers participate in regular small group gathering to improve and grow their visitor skills, as well as have fun and grow in their own faith.

Are you are interested in becoming a better listener in allowing others to express their feelings without judgement or criticism, but with compassion? Do you have some time in your busy schedule to visit a church member going through loss or stress?


Lecture 36 What and How Archaeology Reveals


LIVELY STONES IN BRIEF

A Compendium of Articles on the History of the Congregational Church of Boothbay Harbor, Maine (1766-2016)

In 2016, the authors of *Lively Stones* produced a series of brief articles

containing the essence of each chapter, and those were published consecutively on a monthly basis in the *Boothbay Register*. There is now a booklet available that is a compendium of the twelve articles. It may be useful as a guide to the larger work, or it may be read as a stand-alone, abbreviated history of the Boothbay Presbyterian, now Congregational, UCC church and of the Boothbay region.

"From Memory to Memoir: Reimagining Our Stories"
A six-week workshop in the church library on Wednesday mornings from 10:00 to 12:30, beginning October 11th

By revising a painful chapter of their life's story through creative writing activities, they recast their part in the narrative—discovering unrecognized strengths and reclaiming a sense of their true self—and work free of old beliefs that limit their personal evolution. Oman is a stunning contrast of desert, mountain and coastal landscapes; historic forts and ports; distinctive arts and crafts; and lavish sacred mosques interspersed with arresting contemporary architecture. A country known for its warm hospitality and safe environment, it strikes a balance between its traditional past and its bustling modern society. It is easy to see why Oman is described as "the jewel of Arabia."

The city, Muscat, will be our home as we immerse ourselves in the beauty of the land and its people. We will begin our trip learning about Oman's history and Muslim religion from Al Amana Centre staff and having an overnight retreat at Jebel Shams Mountain, the Grand Canyon of Oman. We will travel to the historic towns of Nizwa and Misfat Al Abreen, visit ancient Nizwa Fort, worship at the Protestant Church of Oman, tour Sultan Qaboos' Grand Mosque, explore the Hindu Temples, engage in Scriptural Reasoning, shop at local sougs, visit Bait Al Zubair Oman's heritage museum and Oman's National Museum, dine on traditional Omani fare and take a sunset Dhow cruise around Muscat's exquisite coastline. Along our way, we will meet the people of Oman and engage in meaningful dialogue to explore the cultural, religious and societal similarities and differences between us as people of faith and people of different cultures. Finally, we will discuss ways to continue these important conversations when we return home to our own communities.

Join us for this once-in-a-lifetime journey as we open our hearts and minds to this magnificent country, shed our false stereotypes and build deeper respect for Christian-Muslim relations.


